4: Review of Minutes of March 1st and May 3rd, 2023 Meetings

5. Correspondence

 Colette Poirier noted that she was impressed with the last issue of the BCTF Magazine

6. Treasurer's Report

- Funds in the Regular Account total \$2,036.62
- Funds in the Gaming Account total \$2,743.18
- Amy McGiven, Treasurer, circulated the bank statements which indicated that no transactions have taken place
- Amy McGiven has finished the 2021/2022 GASR and has applied for the 2023 gaming grant

7. Board of Trustees/District Administration News

K-12 Reporting Order

- Superintendent Kubik advised that information on the Ministry of Education and Child Care's reporting order was circulated with a brochure by email with a link to a website.
- Some DPAC members advised that they did not get the email. Members rechecked their mail – for some, the email did arrive. Superintendent Kubik asked members to check emails they have given to the schools for MyEdBC purposes.

Gradual Kindergarten Entry

- The Ministry of Education and Child Care recommends 25 less hours for Kindergarten students to facilitate a gradual entry.
- Revelstoke only uses 11 hours less rather than the 25 less hours.
- Superintendent Kubik reviewed the reasons for a gradual entry to Kindergarten including the data from the Early Childhood Development Instrument.
- Ecole des Glacier has a program for students going into Kindergarten that starts in December prior to the students entering Kindergarten. During the months December to June they meet once a month and an aptitude type of testing is done. It is a gradual entry but not the same way that SD19 does their gradual entry. The class sizes at Ecole des Glacier are very small (3 students).

School Photography Company is now Mountain West

 Superintendent Kubik confirmed that the district has changed photography companies.

8. Old Business

Professional Development Day (brought forward from May 3rd, 2023 meeting)

• Superintendent Kubik presented on the sessions she attended.

Scott Rothermel Presentation

- Superintendent Kubik confirmed that Scott Rothermel will be providing sessions on sexting, video games and social media in September the dates to be determined.
- The cost for the sessions will be provided through ScreenSmart funding.
- The format for the sessions is to be determined, but will most likely be through Zoom.
- Ecole des Glacier noted that they would like to attend the sessions and share the costs
- It was suggested that the sessions could be held at the school board office or possibly the Revelstoke Performing Arts Centre.
- The sessions would be for students in grades 6 and up.
- The student representatives on the Education Advisory Committee felt that the sessions are important for students.
- Stacey Lamont noted that a social program through the Women's Shelter for courses for students in grades 5, 5 and 7 was held at Columbia Park Elementary School based on its location and vulnerabilities. "Crafty kids" was held after school on Tuesdays and a lunch on Fridays, but it wasn't consistent. The program teaches social skills and outreach but could possibly be expanded to include social media safety.

9. New Business

Ideas for the best use of DPAC funds

- No new ideas were submitted prior to the meeting.
- Superintendent Kubik suggested Gaga ball which is a variant of dodgeball which is usually played outdoors. Courts are built and existing ball can be used.
- Can DPAC funds be used to contribute to the Women's Shelter initiative? Stacey Lamont will get further information about this.
- The funds need to be earmarked by September 30th, 2023 but the next meeting of DPAC is not until October 4th, 2023.
- Funds can be donated to grad celebrations.
- BCCPAC membership needs to be renewed.

RSS PAC Update

May 2023

- District Authority Scholarship presentations were held on May 9th. 37 grade 12s presented for 8 scholarships.
- Grade 12 Capstone Projects occurred on May 15th.
- More than \$80,000 have been committed to local scholarships for students.
- RSS Sr. Girls Soccer, RSS Jr. Girls Soccer, RSS Track and Field team, Mountain Biking team and Golf team all competed this spring. Two members of the Mountain Biking team podiumed at the Provincial Championships, and approximately 20 members of the Track team qualified for Provincials held on June 8th.
- Staff changes Julia Crucil and Rory Luxmoore are retiring.
- Prom was held on May 9th at RSS Common Room. Huge success!
- There was a very caring and professional response to the grade 12 student who was seriously injured in May. A crisis response team was created and planned interventions that were believed to be necessary. Close communication was held with the parents of the injured students, and info was released in a fact-based manner. Students in need of support as they dealt with common responses were (and continue to be) provided exemplary service.
- Drama production was held on May 23rd and 24th and was a big success.
- Athletic Banquet was held on May 30th.
- RSS Art Show was on May 31st in the RSS Common Area.
- Drama and Music productions occur over the first 3 weeks of June.
- Awards Ceremony June 15th.
- Project Completion Day begin week of June 24th.
- Grad ceremony on June 30th. Reverse grad parade on June 29th at 7pm
