## ADMINISTRATION REPORTS

### SUPERINTENDENT KUBIK

#### Administration Report to the Board

Superintendent Kubik presented her Administration Report to the Board and highlighted the following:

- Ready, Set, Learn Spring Fair for children born in 2022, approximately forty-eight families attended
- Met with BC Hydro Revelstoke Unit 6 Community Monitoring Committee members to review the Trades Program at RSS. As part of the proposed project, their aim is to engage with the community and focus on hiring local. They are interested in connecting with K. Scheiber, Work Experience/Career Coordinator, to discuss possible work experience and apprenticeship opportunities for students.

#### Strategic Plan Report to the Board

Superintendent Kubik presented the Numeracy Circles framework: Indigenous Informed Pedagogy, Universal Design for Inclusion, Personalized Learning, and Student-Centered Assessment. Submitted by teachers M. Doebert and N. Ford, this framework illustrates the connections to the district's Strategic Plan.

Superintendent Kubik noted that Professional Educator Susan Leslie will visit Revelstoke later this month to meet with elementary teachers and early learning partners, and work with our K to Grade 2 classes.

#### Artificial Intelligence in SD 19: What We Heard from Our Community

Superintendent R. Kubik shared feedback received from the Community AI evening held on March 11<sup>th</sup> at RSS.

Topics discussed were:

- AI use in schools
- who is monitoring
- environmental impact
- keeping learning human-centered
- AI should be used 'beside', not instead of learning
- Learning environments that support well-being

Trustee Rota commented that the district has done an excellent job with AI discussions involving students, staff, parents, and the community; and noted that no direction has been received from the Ministry of Education and Child Care.

### Review Operating Grant for 2026/27
