
Establish an Education Committee that will

- facilitate discussion regarding changes to the BC curriculum and the BC Education Plan
- support staff efforts to enhance students' national and global perspectives through activities such as cultural exchanges and welcoming foreign students.

2. Enhance communication strategies and foster greater community engagement in the school system

3. Ensure sustainability of our system and resources through effective and efficient management

We continue to maintain a transparent system ensuring that decisions are made with effective consultation and collaborative process. We are focused on protecting direct services for students and the need to sustain the infrastructure that allows us to meet student needs.

Capital Projects

- continue to monitor development related to the Big Eddy site
- continue to monitor market conditions related to the Mountain View site
- gather community input regarding Mount Begbie Elementary
- continue to provide public updates regarding the disposition progress of all three sites
- continue to work closely with the City of Revelstoke on developments of all three sites
- ensure that the Board honours the commitment to the Ministry of Education with respect to the proceeds from the sale of surplus properties.
